# Biography of THE REVEREND STEPHEN A. GREEN

The Reverend Stephen A. Green is the Senior Pastor of The Greater Allen A.M.E. Cathedral of New York. As a global thought leader at the intersection of faith and justice, Rev. Green leads with a commitment to radical love in action.

Rev. Green serves as the Chair of Faith for Black Lives, a faith-based advocacy organization dedicated to nonviolence and social change. Additionally, he is the creator and host of the podcast Sacred Desk with Rev. Stephen A. Green, which features thought-provoking conversations with faith leaders, activists, and artists on current events and social issues.

Rev. Green's dedication to social justice and peacebuilding through love has positioned him as one of the youngest leading civil rights activists in the country. He previously served as the National Director of the Youth and College Division of the NAACP, the nation's oldest and largest grassroots civil rights organization. In that role, he led more than 30,000 young activists across 800 youth councils and college chapters nationwide, driving efforts for racial equality and justice.

Previously, Rev. Green served as pastor of Heard AME Church (Roselle, NJ), Metropolitan AME Church (Harlem, NY) and St. Luke AME Church (Harlem, NY), fostering both spiritual and fiscal growth through prophetic preaching, passionate worship, and community outreach.

Rev. Green is happily married to his partner in life, love and liberation, Lady Braea Tilford Green, founder of Grow Lead Inspire, a movement dedicated to empowering women and girls. He holds a Bachelor of Arts in Religion from Morehouse College, a Master of Divinity from The University of Chicago, and a Master of Sacred Theology from Union Theological Seminary in the City of New York.
